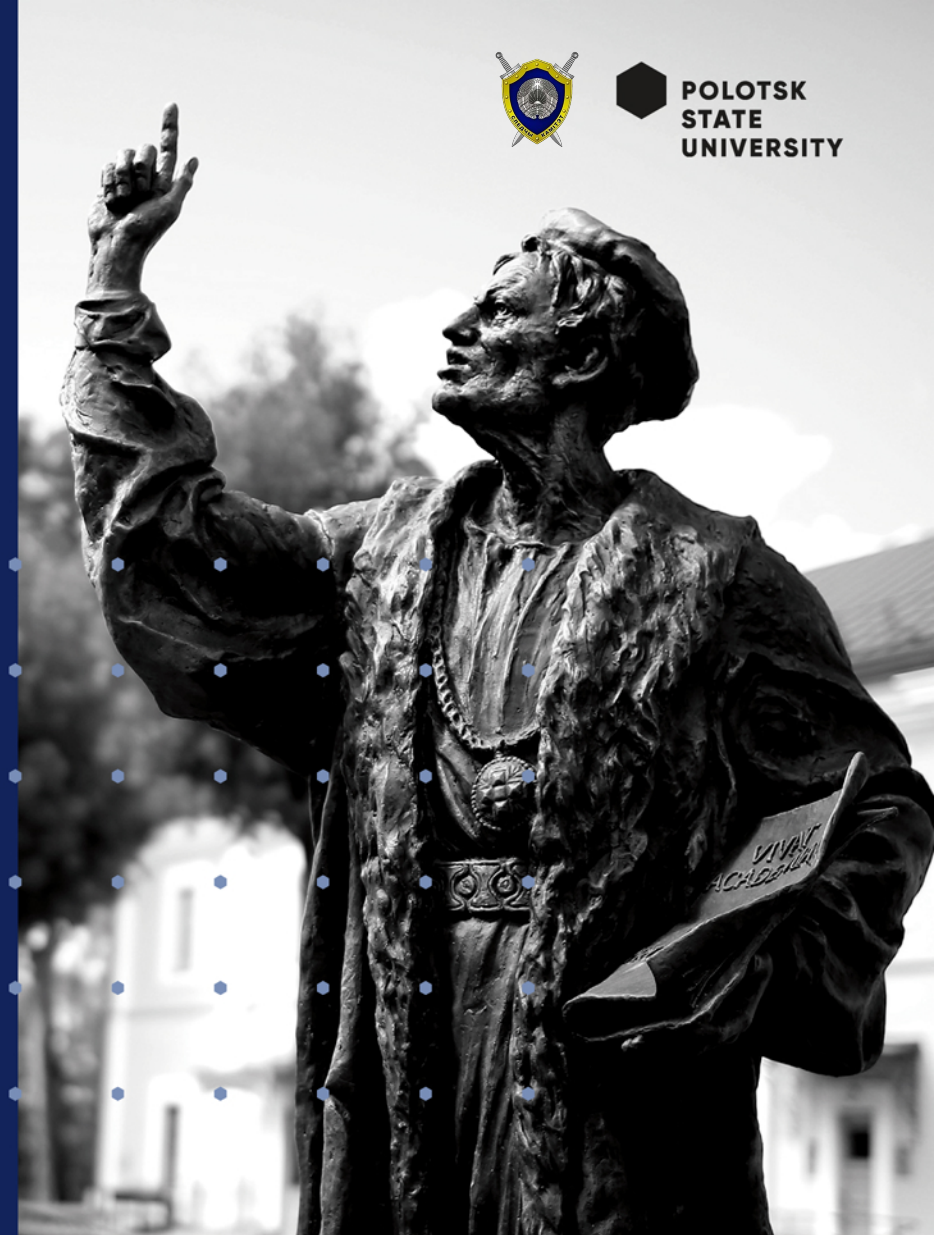

6. Investigative techniques.
7. Restorative justice.

Languages of the Conference: Belarusian, Russian, English

To participate in the Conference, please send an application in English, Russian or Belarusian to the Organizing Committee until May 15, 2019 (application form is provided in Appendix 1).





Materials for publication are accepted until May 15, 2019. The publication is free.

All papers will be published by Polotsk State University before the conference.

If you are interested in our venture, as we hope you are, please take note of the following:

- 1) paper should be written in English, Russian or Belarusian;
- 2) paper should be sent in .doc or .docx format;
- 3) A4 page should be used;
- 4) margins: left, right, top, bottom – 20 mm;
- 5) font size: main body text – 14 points, footnotes – 10 points;
- 6) line spacing – 1,5;





- 7) footnotes should be inserted at the bottom of each page, as in the following example:
 - D. L. Speer, Redefining borders: The challenge of cybercrime, (in:) D. S. Hall, Cybercrime space, Ashgate Dartmouth 2003: p. 25;
 - M. Butler, B. Schindler, F. Sprecher, P. Sutter, Politique de Sécurité Suisse – le vrai rapport, Sécurité & Droit 2011, No 2, p. 30.
- 8) references should be made at the end of the paper, as in the following example:

- 9) each paper should include a short abstract of up to 500 signs in English.
- 10) each paper should include a short, descriptive author's biography of up to 1000 signs;
- 11) paper should not exceed 25 000 signs (including spaces) – it's approximately 15 pages A4.

References should be made one interval after the text, center alignment, bold face.
Please don't use automatic numbering. Reference sources in Russian or Belarusian should be made in their original language.
