This Data Processing Information summarises the information you need to know about how we will use and safeguard your personal data under General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) during our next online academic event titled "Energy transition - better future or green tyranny?".

1. Who can you turn to?

2. What are the primary legal rules?

We inform you that your personal data will be processed in compliance with

- Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the Protection of Natural Persons with regard to the Processing of Personal Data and on the Free Movement of Such Data, and Repealing Directive 95/46/EC (GDPR), and
- Act CXII of 2011 on the Right of Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information
- Act V of 2013 on the Civil Code

4. What data processing are we implementing?

The following data processing takes place during academic the above mentioned educational event – 1. organising and delivering the academic event via MS Teams; 2. making screenshots



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during the event for publication and publicising; 4. checking the study requirement of the students.

4.1. organising and delivering the academic event via MS Teams

What kind of data?	Why do we collect it?	What is the lawful basis of processing?	How long do we store it?
The name of the participant used to log in to MS Teams	To deliver the academic event and check the students' study requirement, it is necessary to manage the name, the user name.	Voluntary contributions (consent)	There is no recording of the personal data besides the personal data of the students and the lecturers. The user name is only reachable to the participants during the event. The students' name is recorded in the proper scene of the Coospace operated by the University of Szeged.

4.2. making screenshots during the event for publication and publicising

We kindly inform you that it is in the organiser's legitimate interest to publicise the academic event; thus, we make screenshots during the event, mainly of the invited lecturer and hosts.

We will inform the participants at the beginning of the event about the time of the screenshots.

All participants have the opportunity to decide whether he/she wants to be in the image or turn the camera off to avoid publicising his/her portrait.

Borne in mind that organising this academic event is within the scope of the fundamental public service missions, mainly to promote science in society. For this purpose, we intend to use the images of the screenshots for this kind of marketing purpose for our academic event to publicise on the printed and online platforms of the Institute of Business Law, especially in brief mentioned in 4.3.



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4.3. Briefing

What kind of data?	Why do we collect it?	What is the lawful basis of processing?	How long do we store it?
The essential points of the academic event, like arguments, questions and answers, etc.	To make a short brief of the academic event.	Voluntary contributions (consent)	No longer than five years.

The brief will be published on the official website of the faculty.

5. Who can know your personal data?

In connection with your personal data may be disclosed to the data controller organisational unit mentioned in point 1 of this Data Processing Information and to those to whom your personal data is given over or transferred (jointly: recipients).

5.1. Giving over data within the organisation

We do not give over data within the organisation.

5.2. Transfer of data outside the organisation

We do not transfer data either inland or abroad.

The data about you will only be processed by persons designated by the data controller as specified in point 1, lawful basis, and the storage period specified in point 4.

6. Do we resort to a data processor?

We use the MS Teams application to deliver the academic event.

7. Do we collect information about you from another source?

No. We collect the information about you from you, and do not collect data from other sources.

8. Is there an automated decision making during data processing?

No.



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9. What are the legal consequences for non-disclosure?

There is no need to previous registration for the event.

It is not possible to control the participation and the delivery of the study requirements of the students if the students fail to sign and log in under their name.

10. What rights do you have?

You have the rights below for our academic event:

1. right to be informed – you have the right to ask for information on the processing of your personal data. We ensure your right to be informed by preparing and publishing this Data Processing Information.
2. right of access – you have the right to request personal information and a copy of the personal data we handle.
3. right to rectification – should you find inaccuracies in your personal data processed by us, you have the right to ask for rectification.
4. right to withdraw the voluntary consent, and the right to erasure – voluntary consent may be withdrawn at any time. We inform you that the withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing before its withdrawal. If processing of data is based on your voluntary consent and there is no other lawful basis for data processing; or following the objection when the processing of data is based on the legitimate interests or public task and there are no overriding legitimate grounds for the processing, then you can ask for the erasure of your personal data.
5. right to object – you have the right to object against data processing based on legitimate interests or public task at any time.
6. right to restrict processing – you have the right to ask for the restriction of the processing of your personal data, e.g. after you find inaccuracies in your personal data, you can ask for restriction of processing while the data controller is checking the data, or e.g. exercise of legal claim.
7. right to data portability – in automated data processing, if data processing is based on voluntary consent or contract and you need your personal data, we will give your personal data processed to you.
8. right to legal remedy – every data subject has the right to legal remedy in case of an infringement.
