- Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the Protection of Natural Persons with regard to the Processing of Personal Data and on the Free Movement of Such Data, and Repealing Directive 95/46/EC (GDPR), and
- Act CXII of 2011 on the Right of Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information
- Act V of 2013 on the Hungarian Civil Code

We inform you that we take image and voice recording (video recording) of the program, in the form of recording of a crowd and in connection with public performance, as well as in the form of individual recording. Please also note that the event is opened to press.

In the form of recording of a crowd and in connection with public performance, we take image and voice recording (video recording) of a public interest considering the fact that the graduation ceremony is closely linked to university life, to the core mission/core task of the university.

According to Subsection (2) of Section 2:48 of Act V of 2013 on the Civil Code, the consent of the data subject shall not be required for recording and for the use of such a recording if the recording was made of a crowd or of a public performance. However, previous information should be given in these cases, so we fulfil the preliminary notification obligation to inform data subjects through this Data Processing Information, and through information provided at the event stating, „We would like to inform you that image and voice recording (video recording) will be taken during this event.”

As the University of Szeged is dedicated to the protection and safety of all kinds of personal data, and the respect of privacy, we inform you that we use these recording (recording of a crowd or public performance) to promote the event and for marketing purposes through the online and offline channels of the University of Szeged, especially the webpage of the Faculty of Law and Political Sciences and its Facebook and Instagram pages.

We inform you that you have the right to object to the recordings of a crowd or public performance

- before the program through the contact person, and
- at the program venue, notifying it for the event organizers

so that the organizers can most effectively resolve not to include you in the recording.

Data processing related to individual recording

In each case, we require the consent of the data subject to produce and use any individual records, in accordance with Subsection (1) of Section 2:48 of Act V of 2013 on the Civil Code. We collect the following information for identification when entering the voluntary consent.

Name (first name, family name)	To identify that person.	On voluntary consent.	Until the voluntary consent is withdrawn.
Birth name (first name, family name)			
Mother's name (optional, if the name does not clearly identify the person)			

Voluntary consent may be withdrawn at any time. We inform you that the withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing before the withdrawal. In the erasure request, we will ask you for the same information as you used to give consent (cf. table above).

The required data will be stored for a maximum of 30 days until the withdrawal (erasure) of the voluntary consent is completed. After that time, we will no longer store the revoked personal data or the erasure request.

4.4. Certificate about the participation

5. Who can get to know your personal data?

In connection with the International Week your personal data may be disclosed to the data controller organizational unit mentioned in point 1 of this Data Processing Information, as well as to those to whom your personal data is given over or transferred (jointly: recipients).

5.1. Giving over of data within the organization

We do not give over data within the organization.

5.2. Transfer of data outside the organization

We do not transfer data either inland or abroad.

The data about you will only be processed by persons designated by data controller as specified in point 1, for the purpose, lawful basis and the storage period specified in point 4.

6. Do we resort to a data processor?

No, we do not resort to a data processor.

7. Do we collect personal data about you from another source?

No. We collect the personal data about you from you, and do not collect data from other sources.

8. Is there an automated decision making during data processing?

No.

9. What are the legal consequences for non-disclosure?

Participation in the programs of International Week of the Faculty of Law and Political Sciences is conditional on the provision of the data detailed in section 4. Accordingly, failure to provide the requested data makes the participation in the event impossible.

10. What rights do you have?

You have the rights below for International Week:

1. right to be informed – you have the right to ask for information on the processing of your personal data. We ensure your right to be informed by preparing and publishing this Data Processing Information.
2. right of access – you have the right to request personal information and a copy of the personal data we handle.
3. right to rectification – should you find inaccuracies in your personal data processed by us, you have the right to ask for rectification.
4. right to withdraw the voluntary consent, and the right to erasure – voluntary consent may be withdrawn at any time. We inform you that the withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing before its withdrawal. If processing of data is based on your voluntary consent and there is no other lawful basis for data processing and there are no overriding legitimate grounds for the processing, then you can ask for the erasure of your personal data.
5. right to restrict processing – you have the right to ask for the restriction of the processing of your personal data, e.g. after you find inaccuracies in your personal data, you can ask for restriction of processing while the data controller is checking the data, or e.g. exercise of legal claim.
6. right to data portability – in automated data processing, if data processing is based on voluntary consent and you need your personal data, we will give your personal data processed to you.
7. right to legal remedy – every data subject has the right to legal remedy in case of an infringement.
